



Bachelor of Criminal Justice (BCRJ) Law Enforcement Concentration (Degree Completion)

The Bachelor of Criminal Justice degree builds upon the strong foundation provided by associate degree programs in Criminal Justice. The program increases and complements the skills already attained by persons working in a variety of positions in law enforcement, homeland security and emergency preparedness or other related fields. **Students must transfer in at least 27-33 semester hours of Criminal Justice courses that were taken in an associate degree program such as one taught by the majority of technical colleges.** Upper level courses in social and behavioral sciences, as well as advanced courses in Criminal Justice, strengthen graduates' ability to relate to and interact with the people they serve. The Bachelor of Criminal Justice with a concentration in Law Enforcement (degree completion) degree is available either online or on campus.

The **BCRJ degree** consists of the following components:

General Education (42 semester hours) - courses in communications, literature, humanities, fine arts, social and behavioral sciences, natural sciences, and mathematics that are common in all college degree programs. These are viewed as being the liberal arts component of a degree and are foundational to the upper division courses.

Transfer Courses, typically from an associate degree program (27-33 semester hours transferred from another institution) - courses in law enforcement, corrections, security, probation, etc. Students transferring between 27-32 hours must make up the remaining hour(s) with classes in Human Services, Management, Organizational Leadership, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology.

Core Courses (24 semester hours) - courses that include 24 semester hours of Criminal Justice, communications, management and social science.

Law Enforcement Concentration (12 semester hours)

General Electives (12 semester hours) - courses that permit students to take additional work in other subjects that interest them and that will be helpful in their career field.

NOTE: A maximum of 64 semester hours of transfer credit will be accepted from an institution where the highest degree awarded is the associate's degree.
